Assumed charge of station Dec 1st at midnight

7.55 am received telephone from Keuper Bernier Vermillion Paint station that a schooner was ashore below his station and wanted me to bring four men to assist him as his crew was getting exhausted having worked since 3.30 A.M, trying to get a line to haul schooner left station at 8 A.M, taking surfmen M^r Chew Cook Packalona and Ocha, arrived at wreck at 9.30 A.M after trying one more shot with out success managed the surfboat making two trips and succeeded in bringing all ashore six seamen and one woman arrived back at station 4.45 P.M, Rec all public property from Keuper Harry Gibb as marked on copy of property returns and gave Receipt for same first trip to schooner Page was Hunter M^r Chew Packalona and Ocha second trip train was Hunter M^r Chew Cook and Ocha
