Erosion Update

On July 30th we attended a meeting at the Community Center in Paradise. MI with the DNR and the Corp. of Engineers out of Detroit, Ml. Present were many concerned land owners on Whitefish bay and the south east side of Lake Superior. The deterioration of the land and beaches is serious. The water level of lake Superior is fourteen inches higher than the 81 year average. There are presently thirteen gates not being opened in Sault Ste. Marie.

On July 31st Charles L. Thompson, Charlie Johnson, and Rob Fergusen. from the Corp of Engineers out of Detroit, MI spent the day with us at Crisp Point. Rob Fergusen had taken aerial photographs of the lighthouse prior to their visit. We are waiting for their advice in writing concerning what to do about the erosion problems.

C.P.L.H.S. Needs Legislation Passed!

The government is moving quickly on the disposition of unneeded lighthouses. Crisp Point Light Historical Society needs to get legislation passed to put it permanently in our hands for all of us to enjoy. Also, for our future generations to visit. There are individuals interested in buying Crisp Point at a substantial price. We do not want this to happen. Our goal is to keep Crisp Point much the way it has been.

Legislation Cont.

The state had the lease on Crisp Point Lighthouse for twenty years prior to the Historical Society. They did nothing. The last work done on erosion was in 1976. I have sent a letter to the State Historical Preservation Office listing what we'd like to do to the lighthouse. Some of what we'd like to do would consist of washing, painting, removing rust, repairing windows, etc.

It's so nice to be able to meet members in person. We hope that we get the opportunity to meet the rest of you soon.




