## Entrance Bldg. Lost

We hoped to get large stone barged in before winter set in. Without the stone, in November we lost the entrance building attached to the tower. Two storms just two weeks apart took the last of the bank. The high water levels of Lake Superior caused too much erosion too quickly. Without the stone at the waters edge and beyond, all efforts failed.

## New Plan to Save Lighthouse

We now have a plan & a contractor ready to bring in stone over land while the ground is frozen. We will need to raise \$42,000 now or we need the work & materials furnished with government help. We need the Governor, John Engler of the state of Michigan to find the monies/special funds, We are also working with Jim Ribbens, Costal Zone Mgmt.
