# Happy Anniversary to Crisp Point Lighthouse.


May 5, 2004 marks the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Crisp Point Lighthouse.





Crisp Point Lighthouse was first proposed in 1896 but wasn't approved by Congress until June 1902.

1903, the newly constructed foghorn building had its boiler destroyed by a fierce Lake Superior storm. When the new machinery for the foghorn was installed it was a chime whistle, which replaced the standard whistle.



1903-1904 the lighthouse was constructed. It wasn't until 1906 that the service building was built and connected to the tower. Prior to Crisp Point lighthouse being built, Crisp

Point Life Saving Station was situated in the area of Crisp Point.

Due to the many ship wrecks such as: the propeller, Indiana in June of 1858, the steamer, City of Cleveland in November of 1864 and the schooner, Southwest in May of 1870 along the eastern end of Lake Superior, the U.S. Congress authorized the establishment of life saving stations for the eastern end of Lake Superior. In addition to the station at Crisp Point, there were stations at Vermillion Point, Two Hearted River, Deer Park and Grand Marais.



Crisp Point Life Saving Station


Crisp Point Life Saving Station was built in 1875 and became operational in 1876 and was known as station No. 10.

Crisp Point got its name from one of the Life Saving Station Keepers, an iron-willed boatman named Christopher Crisp who was appointed as keeper of Station No. 10 on October 3, 1878.

In the mid 1950's with the improvements in navigational equipment and the automation of the lighting systems for lighthouses, there wasn't a need for a fully manned lighthouse station, thus Crisp Point Lighthouse station was closed, but the light still shined with an automated system.

In 1965 the Coast Guard destroyed all the buildings on the grounds only leaving the lighthouse and the attached service building.

1993, Crisp Point Lighthouse was decommissioned and all lighted navigational devices removed. The lighthouse was left to the fate of the big water.



In 1988 while on a vacation in Michigan's Upper Peninsula, Ohio residents, Nellie and Don Ross, were on a narrow back road with no place to turn around when they came upon Crisp Point Lighthouse. This trip down a narrow back road lead to the establishment of the Crisp Point Light Historical Society in 1991.

In November 1996 while still trying to acquire funds to stop the erosion the C.P.L.H.S. lost it's battle to save the service building.

You will get the key for the lighthouse so you can keep it open and greet visitors to Crisp Point. You can get involved with a work project or just hunt the beach for agates.


There will be only one family or couple at a time so you can spend the evening alone. You can bring a camper or set up a tent. Some members even stay in a motel and drive out each day.



The summer of 1999 brought many changes at Crisp Point. The Luce County Road Commission finished the last ½ mile of County Rd. 412 and put in a parking lot just to the south of the lighthouse. We also had several tons of limestone put in front of the tower to slow down the erosion and "Scotty" the painter went to work to restore the splendor of this historical landmark.

Memorial Day weekend 2000 brought many volunteers to "The Point" to plant 90 assorted pine trees.

In July 2001, a boardwalk was constructed at the lighthouse.

This boardwalk has made the lighthouse much more accessible to visitors with special needs and

has helped slow down the erosion of the sand surrounding the lighthouse. Many thanks to all that donated to make this boardwalk a reality.

February 2003, C.P.L.H.S. suffered its greatest loss when President and co-founder of C.P.L.H.S., Nellie Ross, lost her battle with a long time illness.

July 2003 brought the second round of erosion control when John Lechner Construction Company placed some very large pieces of limestone in front and to the east and west of the tower.

This ground stabilization should be adequate for the next stage in the restoration process which is the rebuilding of the service building. There are also plans in the works to replace the eight tower windows and build a restroom with an interpretive center.

With all the volunteers and support in the past we have come a long way in just a few short years. With your continued support and volunteerism, Crisp Point Lighthouse will be here for another one hundred years.


## **Crisp Point Lighthouse Merchandise**

The Expo will be held Saturday and Sunday, June 26 & 27, 2004 so mark your calendar and plan to attend and support C.P.L.H.S.


We will also be at the Alpena Lighthouse Festival October 9 & 10, 2004.
