

2024 marked the fourth year of the MDOT Adopt a Highway clean up. Last year there were 10 bags of trash picked up. The efforts of our volunteers help make our 3 mile stretch of M-123 look beautiful and favorable for the environment. May 11th marked the beginning of prep week to prepare for opening weekend. A huge thank you goes out to the Scouts BSA Troop #337 from Hemlock, MI. The troop assisted with many tasks, including taking loads and loads of sand off the boardwalk.

In addition, benches were repaired, several boardwalk boards were replaced and picnic tables were waterproofed.

Over the past couple years, several sections of rope along the boardwalk were replaced with chain to improve longevity. That project concluded this past season. 




