



We finally had a winter with good snow, and the local businesses that rely on snowmobile tourism were certainly thankful. We are now looking forward to spring again and hopefully great weather. It's also that time of year when we need to remind everyone that our Visitor Center is not open until approximately May 17th, which means the restrooms will not be open. Also, there is still a lot of snow on the ground, especially along the lake where it always drifts really high. Please wait until we open before you venture out to Crisp Point. If you do go before we open and are able to make it to the lighthouse, please remember to Leave No Trace. This means to take everything that you brought in with you back out with you.


We are hoping to get the interior of the tower restored this season. This work would include removing the latex paint on the interior walls that can potentially trap moisture, repairing the walls, refastening any loose railings, and recoating the walls with a new, more breathable coating, likely a limewash.

We also hope to get some windows repaired or replaced. So please be sure to watch our Facebook pages for any potential closures of Crisp Point.

The water level for Lake Superior is still below average, and the Army Corps of Engineers is forecasting it to be below average through August 2025. We are glad to be getting a break again this year from high water levels. We are hoping for more beach again this year!

Four years ago, we adopted a three-mile stretch of M-123 between Luce County Road 500 and Newberry through MDOT's Adopt-A-Highway program. We will be continuing this program this year. If you can help out with any of our litter clean-up events, please see our website Calendar of Events or our Facebook Events listings for more details. The litter pick-ups will be on the following dates, weather permitting: May 10, July 20, and September 20. ## Meet the Keepers

My two granddaughters (Charlotte & Elise Yagow), my wife (Jan Yagow), and I were first-time keepers during August 3-8, 2024. We're from Appleton, Wisconsin.

We first became aware of the Crisp Point Lighthouse during a mid-September 2021 visit with friends. I immediately became interested in becoming a volunteer keeper and started asking questions of the lighthouse keepers who were on duty during our visit. We go camping with all of our 10 grandchildren every summer (2 at a time), and I thought this would be a great service-learning camping experience for my two oldest granddaughters.

So, I became a member of the Crisp Point Lighthouse Historical Society, and two years later (when I thought my granddaughters were old enough), I applied for us to become volunteer lighthouse keepers, and we were accepted!

Providing a volunteer service-learning experience for my granddaughters was my primary motive for signing up. Camping alone on the southern shore of Lake Superior was a huge bonus! We worked—managing and keeping the store, lighthouse, and boardwalks clean and tidy—and enjoyed visiting with people (from all over). It was great! Every evening after our chores were done, we ran for the lake and played in the waves—lots of joyful screaming and laughter! It was our most memorable granddaughter camping experience ever!

On the day that we were to depart and pass the keeper baton to others, my vehicle wouldn't start. I tried everything, but nothing worked. Eventually, I had to call a tow truck to transport the vehicle to Newberry Motors—about 1 hour and 20 minutes driving time away! The kindness of Newberry people was extraordinary. A special shout-out to Cathy Chenard (Lead Volunteer Keeper for Crisp Point Lighthouse) and especially to John Jeszke, sales associate at Newberry Motors, for lending me his truck to retrieve my camper while my vehicle was being serviced and repaired. His kindness was extraordinary!

Volunteering as lighthouse keepers at Crisp Point Lighthouse has become a lifetime memory for my granddaughters. I recommend this experience to grandparents everywhere. Teach your grandchildren to be benevolent and kind. Buy your grandchildren an "experience" as a Christmas or birthday present and forego buying them material things!

This past summer we took our daughter up to the lighthouse for the first time.











#### Crisp Point Memorial and Honorary Plaque Program

Memorialize or honor your loved one with a special plaque at Crisp Point while helping to raise funds for the preservation and restoration of Crisp Point Lighthouse! For a donation of \$450, an image of Crisp Point Lighthouse shines atop of the name of your loved one. The precision tooled bronze plaques are 1/4" thick, 3.5"wide, and 6" tall with an exterior grade clear coat. You can pick from two wording options preceding the person's name:1) "In Memory of" or 2) "In Honor of". Plaques are mounted on existing posts along the walkways at Crisp Point. Plaques are only installed from May to October each year; please allow at least six months for installation to occur.

\*\*CPLHS is not responsible for theft, vandalism, acts of nature, natural deterioration, or any other issues beyond our control to the plaques once installed at Crisp Point. CPLHS reserves the right to remove plaques for any reason.\*\*

Where it says "(Optional) Use this donation for", make sure to choose "In Memory of Plaque" or "In Honor of Plaque" from the pull-down menu. You will also have the option to add more to the donation to help offset the processing fees. On the next page, also tell us the name you want on the plaque where it says "Write a note (Optional)".


